**James Der Derian** is Professor of Political Science at UMASS/Amherst and Professor of International Relations (Research) at Brown University, where he directs the InfoTechWarPeace Project ([www.infopeace.org](http://www.infopeace.org)). He is the author of *On Diplomacy: A Genealogy of Western Estrangement* (Blackwell 1987), *Antidiplomacy: Spies, terror, speed, and war* (Blackwell 1992) and *Virtuous War: Mapping the military-industrial-media-entertainment network* (Westview 2001). He has edited *The Virilio Reader* (Blackwell 1998), *International/Intertextual Relations: Postmodern Readings of World Politics* (with Michael J. Shapiro) (Lexington Books 1989) and *International Theory: Critical Investigations* (Macmillan 1995) and published articles in many journals including *International Studies Quarterly*, *Millennium*, *Review of International Studies*, and *Wired*.
